
FOR TRAVELERS

It even explains a tipping etiquette for each country.







# VETERANS DAY, ONCE RECOGNIZED AS ARMISTICE DAY



Veterans Day is Nov. 11, a federal holiday that is meant to honor all veterans of the uniformed services who served or are still serving during times of peace as well as war. Veterans Day has its origins at the end of World War I when at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, the fighting ended with the signing of an armistice. In 1919, President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the first Armistice Day, Nov. 11. Armistice Day became a federal holiday by congressional act approved May 13, 1938. In 1954, at the urging of veterans' organizations, Congress changed the name to Veterans Day to honor service members who had served in all of the nation's wars. (U.S. Department of Defense website, defense.gov)

A program from the Nineteenth Armistice Day Celebration of Lott Goins Chapter No. 4, D.A.V. (Disabled American Veterans) of W.W. is housed in the Ouachita Parish Public Library Special Collections. Before World War II, World War I was sometimes referred to as "the world war" and "the great war." The celebration was held Nov. 11, 1937, and included scripture readings, songs, speakers, and a parade led by Ben Burton's Band.

The program has been scanned and is in the Louisiana Digital Library. (Louisianadigitallibrary.org).

The Lott Goins Chapter of the D.A.V. was named for Lott Goins, a Monroe soldier who died in World War I. There is not a great deal of information on Goins but a few sources in Special Collections and online have been identified. A manuscript in the Ouachita Parish Public Library Special Collections, Record of Veterans World War Ouachita Parish, lists Lott Goins as a 29-year-old private affiliated with Company A, 805 Pion Inf who died of diphtheria Sept. 16-18, 1918. The abbreviations in the entry stand for 805th Pioneer Infantry, an African-American infantry regiment organized in May of 1918 according to Victory: History of the 805th Pioneer Infantry American Expeditionary Forces by Major Paul Bliss. This now out-of-print 1919 book lists Corporal Lot Goins as one of the "Honored Dead" of the 805th. Lott is spelled with one t instead of two and his rank is listed as corporal instead of private in Bliss's book.

A Sept. 23, 1918, *Monroe* News-Star article "Private Lott Goins Buried Here Today" stated that Lott's funeral was the first military funeral in Monroe during the great world war.

Goins' WWI draft card is available on Ancestry.com which is accessible at Main and all other Ouachita Parish Public Library branches.

Quebec, Monday, September 16th and was buried at 10 o'clock this morning in the cemetery at New Hope church, the funerall services being in charge of the Home Service Department of the Monroe Chapter American Red Cross, Private Coines died in the service

of his country and while he did not fall amid the glory and carnage of the bloody battle fields of France, he gladly gave all that he had and sacrificed all that he held dear for his country in defense of democracy and world freedom.

The burial of this humble private in our midst today has the honor and distinction of being the first military funeral in Monroe during the great world war. May his patriotism be not forgotten, or his sacrifice be unrewarded. Peace to his soul and honor to his memory.
